

Parent Information

1. Make athletic participation for your daughter and others a positive experience. Applaud good plays by your team and members of the opposing team. Be a role model of good sportsmanship for your daughter and other young athletes.
2. All officials are attempting to call a match to the best of their ability, without bias. We all need to give the officials the respect to which they are entitled, even when we disagree or feel that they have made a mistake.
3. Playing time is the decision of the head coach. Our goal is to both develop your daughter as well as achieve success. If you wish to discuss your daughters status, make an appointment to do so. Please do not approach a coach during a tournament to discuss playing time. Do understand that if your daughter is gone from practice, the coach may cut back on playing time in the next tournament, rewarding those who have been there.
4. Get to know the parents of the other players on the team and in the club. You all share the highs and lows of competition. With positive interaction our hope is that you'll form lasting friendships.
5. All information regarding upcoming tournaments will be given to your daughter and emailed to you asap.
6. If you feel the need to see the director he will always be available to speak to you. We all want to insure that your daughter has a positive experience in our club and we will do everything in our power to make that happen.
7. All forms must be back by the 2nd practice. The AAU fee is paid for by the club.
8. The cost of the club is \$350. A payment of \$175 must be made by our first tournament on Mar. 29th., full payment by May 1st. Checks should be made out to Mt. Jrs. VBC. If you choose to mail it, send it to Wade Wells at 3700 Old Hardin Rd. Should your daughter decide not to complete the season there is no refund. In addition to club expenses the fee also covers two nights lodging at the tournament in Provo, UT. There is also no refund if your daughter decides not to attend.
9. Reservations for lodging on out of town trips are the responsibility of the family. If the team parent is able to get a block of rooms at a reduced rate they will be in contact with you.
10. The lodging at Provo will be 4/5 to a room (by teams) and the reservations will be made for them. The coach will decide on room pairings. Upon arrival, the clerk will have a rooming list. Check in and a key will be issued. If we are unable to procure rollaways, we will reserve another room.
11. Officiating responsibilities are shared equally with all the team members. No one is allowed to leave the gym until the match your daughters team is officiating is completed.
12. While in Provo we hope you will allow your daughters to have dinner(s) with the team. This may be the last time the players and coaches are together.
13. The tournament schedule may be subject to change. We hope to give you enough time to make alternate arrangements should that occur.
14. Unlike previous years, all the players will now be expected to provide the help needed for our home tournaments. The 16's/18's will help on Sat., and the 14's on Sun. They will be assigned duties in concessions, product sales, etc. Individual parents will be there to oversee each area.
